FP Baby Sign Language - University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee

- Research on baby sign language has found that teaching baby signs improved cognitive and emotional development Far from slowing down speech, baby sign language actually increases the rate of verbal development and at form the signs
- Only start with the first 4 when showing them
